APSID-Sponsored Fellowship for Junior Members (2025)

Aims of the Fellowship:

This fellowship is intended to support junior members to:

- Identify gaps in clinical service, diagnostic/therapeutic procedures, or laboratory techniques in primary immunodeficiency at their home institution (can be clinical or laboratory-focused).
- Identify an APSID Center of Excellence (CoE) that routinely provides this service.
- Undertake targeted learning at the host center to transfer expertise back to the home institution.

APSID Centers of Excellence (CoE)

- 1. Joint BCH-HKU CoE:
 - o Department of Immunology, National Center for Children's Health, Beijing Children's Hospital, Capital Medical University, Beijing, China
 - Paediatric Immunology, Allergy and Infectious Diseases, Department of Paediatrics and Adolescent Medicine, The University of Hong Kong, Hong Kong, China
- 2. Pediatric Allergy Immunology Unit, Department of Paediatrics, Advanced Pediatrics Centre,

Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh, India

- Applicants to this CoE require approval by the Deanery of the institute. For Indian candidates, applications from only government hospitals, colleges, institutes, or universities are generally approved.
- 3. **Department of Paediatrics**, Graduate School of Biomedical & Health Sciences, Hiroshima University, Hiroshima, Japan

Eligibility Criteria

- 1. Maximum age of candidates is 40 years as of the date of application. Applicants born before **1st January 1985** will not be considered under this fellowship.
- 2. Active APSID member.
- 3. Travel visa can be approved.
- 4. APSID faculty must be present at the host center to supervise the junior member.
- 5. Conditions of the host institution must be fulfilled (e.g. health, travel, ethical requirements).
- 6. Candidates must define **Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Realistic, and Time-Bound (SMART)** objectives along with a plan and schedule before beginning the Fellowship.
 - o This plan must be discussed and agreed upon with the supervising faculty at the host center and approved by the APSID Executive Board.

Fellowship Deliverables

- 1. **Commitment to setting up** the required clinical, therapeutic, or diagnostic service at the home institution after completing the fellowship.
 - A formal report must be completed at the end of the fellowship and co-signed by the host institution supervising faculty and the candidate's home institution head of department.
 - o This report will then be reviewed by the APSID Executive Board.

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Funding will include:

- Airfare: USD 1000 for regional (within Asia), USD 2000 for international
- Accommodation: USD 500-1000 (location dependent)
- **Miscellaneous expenditures** eg local ground transportation, visa applications, attending conferences: USD 1000

Application Process:

Interested candidates must submit:

- 1. Completed Application form
- 2. Latest CV and proof of APSID membership
- 3. Proposed fellowship objectives and plan, signed by the home institution supervisor.
- 4. Acceptance letter from the host CoE supervisor, confirming the proposed schedule and supervision.

Deadline:

Applications for the 2025 Fellowship must be submitted by 31st July 2025. Incomplete or late submissions will not be considered.
